

Flexible payment options

Option 1: Automatic Payment Plan

Receive invoices and make your payments in less frequent instalments based on the date of enrolment.


Option 4: Pay with FlexPay

Personal Fundraising Page Step by Step:

- 1. Once you enrol, you'll have received an email from EF asking you to log in to your personal profile. If you haven't logged in/created this yet, you'll need to do so.
- 2. In your personal profile, click on your tour:
- 3. Here you'll be able to see a list of your to-do items, balance owing, days until departure, and has a spot for your passport information.
- 4. On the left-hand side, there's a taskbar. Click on "Payments"
- 5. On the right, there'll be a blue box that says, "Fundraising" From here, you can click on "view page" which brings you to your fundraising page where others can make donations
